ONTARIO STAY-AT-HOME ORDER

The new restrictions will not change the way we are currently able to worship. Our parish schedule remains the same.

We continue to livestream services to ensure that our senior parishioners and those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions are able to stay home and stay safe but remain connected to parish life. It is important that the vulnerable of our community are not attending church at this time. Dispensation from the Sunday Eucharist remains in place.

Health officials have expressed concern about parishioners congregating / visiting with one another in or around the church before or after services. If this continues to happen it will put in jeopardy our ability to worship together in person. We strongly encourage parishioners to not arrive early and to leave immediately after worship.
