The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is celebrated with those who are seriously ill, preparing for surgery and the frail and elderly. This sacrament of healing is meant to heal the whole person -- spiritually, physically, and mentally -- while at the same time reassuring the person of God's love and mercy.

There will be three priests available to hear confessions before Mass from 10:00 am to 10:50 am. Both confessionals have handsets for the hard of hearing and an additional accessible confessional will be set up at the church's northeast doors.

#### A Declaration on Human Dignity

On April 8, 2024, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith published "Dignitas Infinita" (Infinite Dignity) – a Declaration on Human Dignity. It states: "Every human person possesses an infinite dignity, inalienably grounded in his or her very being, which prevails in and beyond every circumstance, state, or situation the person may ever encounter. This principle, which is fully recognizable even by reason alone, underlies the primacy of the human person and the protection of human rights."
