## **Recognizing Jesus**

The readings for the 3rd Sunday in Easter encourage us to walk the path of discipleship. In the first reading, Peter boldly proclaims the Good News. The psalm reminds us that God will guide us along the path of life. The second reading explains that Jesus died so we could have new life. And in the Gospel, two disciples encounter the risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus.

The two disciples don't recognize Jesus when he joins them on the road. Similarly, it can be hard for us to recognize Jesus' presence during uncertain or difficult times in our lives. Like the disciples, we are invited to talk openly with him about how we feel, unafraid to share our negative feelings and disappointments. Through honest prayerful conversation, we may also start to see things differently.

In the end, at the breaking of the bread, the disciples clearly see Jesus. Their hearts turn from disappointment to joy -- and they can't wait to share the good news with the others.

**Reflection Questions:** 

- Are there times when I don't recognize Jesus' presence in my life?
- How can I be more open and honest when I pray?
- How will I joyfully share the Good News with others?
