

Second Sunday of Easter



The readings for Divine Mercy Sunday show us that the mercy of God is given to all of us, even though we turn away again and again. In the gospel, Jesus appears to the disciples. Then he comes back and lovingly helps Thomas overcome his doubts.

Jesus invites Thomas to touch his wounds and to believe. Thomas responds with a powerful declaration of faith: "My Lord and my God!" When Thomas doubts, Jesus does not rebuke him or shame him. He simply offers him the evidence he needs to believe and invites him into a deeper relationship. We all have moments of doubt and fear, times when we struggle to believe or to trust in God's plan for us. But like Thomas, we are invited to bring our doubts and questions to Jesus, who offers us peace and the evidence we need to believe.

Reflection Questions:

- How are my current relationships with God, others and creation?
- Do I struggle with doubt and fear in my relationship with God? How do I allow His peace to calm my fears?
- How do I respond to situations of division in my relationships with others and grow my empathy, understanding, and willingness to forgive?

Marian Consecration - April 8

Pope Francis has asked the Faithful to renew the Act of Consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord on April 8th.

To consecrate means to "set apart as holy", to designate an object or person for a sacred purpose. For example, through the Sacraments we are consecrated, or set apart, as God's people. Consecration is a response to the Lord's invitation to live in holiness and self-giving.

What is a Marian consecration? Mary is a supreme example of what it means to devote one's life to God – to love God. She is the ultimate mother, and a mom always wants the very best for her children. Mary wants all people to have a deep and loving relationship with her Son, our Lord. There is a rich tradition in the Church with respect to Marian Consecration.

On Monday, April 8, the Day of Consecration, everyone is invited to pray the rosary at 8:20 am followed by Mass. We will also say the rosary at 8:00 pm followed by the Act of Consecration and Benediction with the Blessed Sacrament.
