Gaudete! Rejoice! Today, on the third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, Latin for "Rejoice". The third Advent candle is pink and represents Joy and rejoicing. It serves as a reminder that the birth of Jesus is a cause for great celebration and happiness.



Reflection Questions:

• Today's Second Reading (1 Thessalonians 5:16-24) speaks of rejoicing even in difficult times. How can I find joy even during challenging situations?

• In John's Gospel, John the Baptist embodies the role of a witness to the one true Light, Jesus Christ. How can I be a bearer of Christ's light in my community?

• How can I embody the humility and dedication of John the Baptist in my own life as a Christian?
