Since 2020 the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops have been working on organizing a delegation to the Holy See to foster meaningful dialogue and healing with Indigenous Peoples and the Holy Father. The delegation will visit Rome December 17 - 20, 2021. "Pope Francis is deeply committed to hearing directly from Indigenous Peoples, expressing his heartfelt closeness, addressing the impact of colonization and the role of the Church in the residential school system, in the hopes of responding to the suffering of Indigenous Peoples and the ongoing effects of intergenerational trauma. The Bishops of Canada are deeply appreciative of the Holy Father's spirit of openness in generously extending an invitation for personal encounters with each of the three distinct groups of delegates – First Nations, Métis and Inuit."

We pray for the children who died in Kamloops and in residential schools throughout the country – they must not be forgotten. We must also recognize the betraval of trust by many Catholic leaders who were responsible for operating residential schools. abandoning their obligation to care for young and innocent children. We all seek the truth and this tragic discovery provides yet another opportunity for us to learn more about this dark chapter in our history and the painful journey experienced by so many of our Indigenous brothers and sisters. **Cardinal Collins**
