Unity in the Trinity

One of the most striking aspects of the Holy Trinity is the unity that exists between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Despite being distinct persons, they are united in their nature and purpose.

As Catholics, we are called to reflect this same unity in our own lives. Just as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are united in love, we are called to love one another and to work together in unity for the sake of the Gospel. This means setting aside our own individual interests and desires in order to serve the greater good of the Church and the world.

The readings for Trinity Sunday also remind us that our salvation is a gift of God's love and grace, not something we can earn or deserve by our own merits. The Father sent His only Son to redeem us from sin and death and to reconcile us with Him. The Son, by His death and resurrection, made it possible for us to share in His divine life and to become children of God. The Holy Spirit, poured out on us in Baptism and Confirmation, empowers us to live as faithful disciples of Christ and to bear witness to His Gospel in the world.

Reflection Questions:

- In what ways can I reflect the unity and love of the Holy Trinity in my life?
- How can I overcome my human tendency of focusing too much on my own individual interests?
- How does the Holy Spirit empower me to live as a faithful disciple of Christ and bear witness to His Gospel in my life?

Help Support a Refugee Family arriving in Canada on July 6

The Office of Refugees at the Archdiocese of Toronto needs urgent help to welcome and settle a refugee family (mother and daughter) from the Democratic Republic of Congo. The refugees' application for resettlement to Canada has been processed and approved by Immigration Canada. Now, we need volunteers who will support the family when they arrive to Canada to adjust to life and integrate into the community.

Volunteers are needed to help host and support the refugee family during the initial one-year period of settlement from the time of arrival to Canada. More specifically, volunteers will pick up the refugees at the airport on arrival, arrange for accommodation (housing), assist to accompany the refugees to apply for various government services including government documents like health card (OHIP), social insurance number (SIN), etc., assist with grocery shopping, orient them on how to use public transit, take to scheduled appointments, etc.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will provide financial support to assist the day-to-day needs of the refugee family. The parish can also mobilize additional supports, especially in-kind items, etc., as needed.


