Third Sunday of Lent



The parable of the barren fig tree in the Gospel highlights God's patience as he waits for us to change and grow in faith. Although the fig tree has not produced fruit in three years and should be cut down, the gardener asks for more time. Similarly, we are given chances to repent and improve in our lives. God doesn't give up on us easily but waits for us to bear fruit. Bearing fruit means living out our faith through good actions. Through almsgiving, we are called to give, driven by a love for God and our neighbours. In this season of Lent, we reach out to people in need—not just with our money—but with our time and our talents.

Reflection questions:

- How do I see God's patience in my own life?
- What can I do to bear fruit and show my faith through actions?
- In what ways can I share God's love to others?

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION - SCRUTINIES

This Sunday at the 9:30am Mass, we celebrate the first of the three scrutinies. The three scrutinies are celebrated during Lent and are designated to help "the Elect," those participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), prepare to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation & Holy Communion at Easter Season. Our RCIA candidates are: Abigail, Aidan, Alison, Andrea, Anthony, Chris, Davide, Ellena, Helena, Leo, Philip, Romeo, Scott, Stacy, and Tessa.

The scrutinies are rites of conversion and repentance. Though the word "scrutinize" sounds negative, its true meaning is simply "to see clearly or inspect closely." During the scrutinies, the community prays for the candidates to be protected from temptation and be drawn closer to Christ.

First Scrutiny: This weekend of the first Scrutiny, the Gospel is about the Samaritan Woman at the well. Jesus asks her for some water, but he also offers her living water, promising eternal life.

The Elect desire a new life through Christ in greater fullness. For those of us who are already Catholic, the scrutinies are an opportunity to experience the same gift of renewal of life from God.
