PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD



The readings for Palm Sunday focus on the sacrifice which Jesus Christ made for us. As we contemplate the suffering and death of Jesus, we are struck by the paradox of His divinity and His willingness to endure such great pain and humiliation. He turned to prayer, even in his darkest hour in the garden of Gethsemane and entrusted all into the loving care of his Father. He remained obedient, even when His closest friends betrayed him and abandoned him.

As followers of Jesus, we are also called to trust in God completely. In the face of trials and difficulties, we can turn to prayer and trust God's loving care.

Reflection Questions:

- Are there times when I find it difficult to trust in God's plan for my life? What gets in the way of my faith and trust?
- How do I respond when facing suffering or adversity in my life? Do I turn to prayer and rely on God's strength and comfort, or try to handle things on my own?
- How can I deepen my relationship with God?

Church open from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm for private prayer.

Good Friday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence from meat to honour the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare to share more deeply in the joy of his resurrection. Fasting obtains its full meaning when we open our hearts to God in prayer.

The law of "abstinence from meat" binds those who are 14 and older; the law of "fasting" binds those from 18 to 59 years of age.

Easter Vigil - March 30 at 8:00 pm There will be no 9:00 am , 5:15 pm Mass or Confessions. Everyone is invited to bring bells to ring during the Gloria.

Easter Sunday – March 31

8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am and 12:30 pm Children at the 9:30 am Mass are asked to be with their families - there will be no Liturgy of the Word with Children.

Additional seating available in the parish hall during Holy Week.

Liturgical Bites: The Sacred Triduum - The word "Triduum" comes from the Latin word meaning "three days," and encompasses the three most sacred days in the Church year. It begins at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches a high point at the Easter Vigil, and concludes with evening prayer at sundown on Easter Sunday. The liturgical celebrations during the Triduum are rich with symbolism and flow from one to another in a seamless way. While it may appear as if these liturgies are separate and distinct, they are intended to be one continuous celebration that commemorates the passion. death and resurrection of Jesus. All Catholics are encouraged to observe the entire Triduum by attending all the liturgies.

As part of our Holy Week **TENEBRAE** will ENEBRAC once again be presented on Tuesday, March 26, 7:30 pm to 9:00 pm in the church. Tenebrae, meaning darkness, is a moving experience that conveys the sorrow of Holy Week through solemn and noble music and scripture. Free will offerings welcome.
