## Life, Death, and Resurrection

The readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent are about how God can take us from death to new life. The first reading tells us of God's desire to bring us back to life. The second reading tells us if Christ dwells in us, we will have new life as He does. And the

gospel tells how Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead.

Jesus receives word that his friend Lazarus is ill. However, instead of rushing to his side, Jesus delays his journey for two days. By the time he arrives in Bethany, Lazarus has been dead for four days. When he sees Lazarus' sister Martha, Jesus tells her that he is the resurrection and the life, and that whoever believes in him will never die.

When Jesus arrives at Lazarus' tomb, he weeps and then commands Lazarus to come out of the tomb. Lazarus emerges, still wrapped in his burial cloths, and Jesus instructs the people around him to unbind him and let him go.


This passage is a powerful reminder of the hope and promise of resurrection that is at the heart of our Christian faith. Jesus' raising of Lazarus prefigures his own resurrection, which we will celebrate in just a few weeks on Easter Sunday. We are also called to have faith in God's power and goodness, even in difficult circumstances.

**Reflection Questions:** 

- How do I encounter Jesus during difficult moments in my life?
- How has my faith been a source of strength during challenging times?
- In what ways can I share the hope and promise of resurrection with others who are struggling with grief or despair?

- Completed the repairs to the Bells (\$4,150 fully funded by parishioner donations)

- Elevator service expenses (\$2,010)

## **Digital Payment Pilot at OLS**
