He tells them that he will ask the Father to send them another Advocate, the Spirit of truth, who will be with them forever. This Advocate will teach them all things and remind them of everything Jesus has said to them.

As Catholics, we believe in the Holy Trinity – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, and it is through the Holy Spirit that we receive the grace and strength to live our lives. The Holy Spirit is not just an abstract concept, but a real and present force in our lives. When we receive the Sacraments, particularly Baptism and Confirmation, we are filled with the Holy Spirit and become part of the Body of Christ.

Ultimately, the love we express for each other is the love of the Spirit. It is through the Holy Spirit that we can love one another as Jesus has loved us and are empowered to be witnesses to Christ in the world.

# Sowing Seeds of Hope



At all Masses next weekend, members from the OLS Social Justice Group will be handing out small packages of 12 Bush Beans. They invite all parishioners to take a package home and plant them in a sunny patch in their gardens. Apart from needing a good amount of sun, these beans aren't fussy and can be planted in pots, hanging baskets, planters or a patch of soil. This is a great activity for all -- especially with children!

This initiative by the OLS Social Justice Group was inspired by Pope Francis' 2015 letter to the whole Church entitled "*Laudato* <u>Si</u>" (Praise be to you). Pope Francis shared his reflections on the vital importance of living in greater harmony with nature and one another. Like the 12 Apostles who were sent out, the hope is that these seeds will result in an abundant harvest to share!

On the weekend of August 12th and 13th, we invite you to bring back some of your bean harvest to Mass! Our collective harvest will then be donated to the kitchen of the Good Shepherd Refuge.

### **Canadian Bishops Address Assisted Suicide Legislation**

The <u>Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (</u>CCCB) have issued an *Open Letter to the Government of Canada* as well as a Message to the Catholic Faithful regarding federal legislation which, by March 17, 2024, will permit those living with mental illness to access euthanasia.

As stated in both the Open Letter and Message, "Expanding access to euthanasia and assisted suicide for individuals living with a mental illness closes the door to any hope of recovery...undermines the universal and inviolable dignity of human life and harms the building up of society."

Referencing our common dependency on each other in varying degrees throughout life, the CCCB calls on the federal and provincial/territorial governments to allocate more resources and funding to mental healthcare as well as to palliative care.

The CCCB also encourages the faithful "to witness to life, to tend to and accompany the sick, to resist pressure, to participate in the Special Joint Committee on Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) and to pray that our lawmakers see the harm in what they are permitting to take place."
