Advent is made up of four weeks, divided into two periods: 1 First Sunday of Advent until December 16 FOCUS: Christ's second coming at the end of time 2 December 17 to 24 FOCUS: Preparation for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ

The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year

Through prayer, spiritual reading, acts of charity, and participation in Eucharist, Advent helps us to expand the meaning of our lives, so that we are not ends in ourselves, but a people who seek Christ as our hopeful end and joyful fulfilment



This Sunday marks the beginning of the beautiful season of Advent, a time to deepen our relationship with Christ. The readings tell us that it's time to rouse from our sleep and prepare! In the first reading we hear that God will establish His Kingdom and we must be ready to walk in the light of God. In the second reading, Paul warns us to be awake. In the Gospel, Jesus warns us not to be unprepared, as people were in the days of Noah. This is a time to prepare for our Lord to come into our hearts. **Reflection Questions:** 

- - What is my focus as I begin to prepare for Christmas?
    - Do I see Christ in the people around me?
  - What do I need to do now, to be ready for the coming of the Lord?

Preparations for Christmas often involve putting up decorations, purchasing gifts and making food. But these are not the only things we need to do to prepare for the coming of Jesus Christ. We also need to prepare our hearts. The Gospel tells us that we must think ahead.

As we prepare our homes and our hearts for Christmas, the Lord is in our midst. He is in the child who doesn't get Christmas presents. He is in the homeless man who has nowhere to go for Christmas. He is in the lonely and broken-hearted. We are called to make preparations in all of the places where we will encounter Him during this holy season.
