Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



The readings today focus on marriage, family, and living as children of God. God created woman from man's rib, symbolizing that they are of the same flesh and meant to support each other. Marriage is a sacred bond that calls for mutual respect and love. We are reminded to cherish and nurture our relationships, keeping them strong and faithful. Family is the basic unit of society, and we are called to reflect God's love by caring for each other. A strong foundation in the family helps to build a stronger community and church.

Just as children trust their parents completely, Jesus teaches that we must depend on God to enter heaven. We are God's children, and He loves us unconditionally. We can live more fully and freely in God's love without worrying about judgement from others, letting go of our fears and trust that God will take care of us.

The Stewardship Journey



"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." - Peter 4:10

What is Stewardship?

As individuals, we are stewards or managers of the gifts God has given us. We are called to imitate Jesus by being other-centred rather than self-centred and be grateful and generous with our gifts. Living out our faith means that we are expected to share our time, talent and treasure to build up our Church and make our world a better place. The goal of stewardship at Our Lady of Sorrows is for us to become more involved, and in turn, deepen our relationship with God.

How can I grow in my faith?

The more deeply we grow in love for God, the more our hearts see stewardship as a way of life and see the gifts we have received from God -- and respond in gratitude with the gift of self.

In the deepening conversion of love, a steward learns to give of self, not out of obligation and duty, but out of a sincere and growing desire. As Archbishop Leo reflects in his 2024 Stewardship address:

"Stewardship is the crucial process or a way of living our Catholic faith...a life-giving development of faith and engagement...a living and active commitment that changes life and changes lives -- not a one-time act of giving or sacrifice."

What's the best path for me?

Stewardship is a natural part of our faith journey. The first step is to reflect on your own personal talents and actively discover what options are available. Ask yourself: What are my natural talents? What do I like to do?

Introducing: Jennifer Sontrop



Why were you drawn to volunteer in this ministry at OLS? It had been several years since I served in a ministry at the parish level and it felt like the right time to step into something. My interest began when I attended a couple of bible studies that were led by Seminarian Ryan Nigli – now Father Ryan. I really enjoyed the opportunity to dive deeper into Scripture – but I wasn't making the time to do this consistently on my own time. When I heard that another person was needed to help lead this ministry, I was immediately drawn to it.

What personal talents do you have and enjoy sharing? I'm a teacher by training and really enjoy facilitating discussions. I also studied some theology several years ago and I'm a life-long learner when it comes to growing in my knowledge and understanding of faith. I love sharing this with others.

What skills would be a good fit for others who are interested in this ministry? The top items that come to mind are:

- a love of Jesus and being Catholic, and a desire to share that with others
- a good foundational understanding of the Catholic faith, and a yearning to learn more
- an appreciation for scripture as part of prayer life
- past participation in bible study classes, or some personal study
- comfortable speaking in front of a group and facilitating small group discussions

How has your volunteer stewardship in this ministry helped you grow in your faith? Taking on a leadership role has helped me make time for scripture as part of my prayer life. While I lead and facilitate the small group discussions; we all unlock the mysteries of the bible together. This has also helped me learn more and deepen my personal understanding of what our faith teaches. It all goes together – and it's beautiful! I also find my desire to make time for reading the bible in my personal prayer time continues to grow. God speaks to us personally through his living Word, but it's up to me to make time to read and listen.
